## QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER

## THE DAY YOU ARRIVE...

Come with patience and an open mind.

Listen and take notes in orientation.

Bring your written questions.

#### **ARE YOU AUTHORIZED?**

You will not be permitted to begin the move in process unless you have been authorized by the Business Office. This means you have completed all financial obligations set by the Financial Aid and/or Business Office.

An authorized resident will have received their room assignment in their Ranken email account.

#### **DID YOU CONTACT YOUR ROOMMATE?**

Contacting your roommate before moving into the residence hall is very important. This is an opportunity for you to get to know more about the person you will be living with for the school year.

There will Roommate Workshops available on move in day. There will be posted signs in the Walker Hall Lobby for details.

## DO YOUR FOLLOW WALKER HALL ON SOCIAL MEDIA?

There are two pages on Facebook for Walker Hall. There is Residential Life at Ranken Technical College which is open to everyone and there is Ranken Technical College-Walker Hall which is for <u>residents only</u>. Students must request to be part of the group. Authorized residents will be approved.

## PARKING BEHIND WALKER HALL ON THE COOK LOT

### COMING IN FROM THE SOUTH OR EAST

Take Kingshighway North to Page Blvd. Make a right onto Page (east). Make a right onto Taylor (south) and take the next left on Cook Avenue. You should see a guard shack straight ahead. Proceed straight and you should see Walker Hall on the left. Park your vehicle(s) in the lot in front of south entrance of Walker Hall.

### COMING IN FROM THE NORTH OR WEST

Take Kingshighway South to Page Blvd. Make a left on Page (east). Make a right onto Taylor (south) and take the next left on Cook Avenue. You should see a guard shack straight ahead. Proceed straight and you should see Walker Hall on the left. Park your vehicle(s) in the lot in front of south entrance of Walker Hall.



RANKEN TECHNICAL COLLEGE HAS THE RIGHT TO AMEND THIS LIST BASED ON THE NEEDS OF THE CAMPUS.

Ranken respects student's rights of expression and recognizes the importance for residents to make residential units an expression of their personality.

However, the College expects students to be responsible and show good taste when decorating.
Residential life staff members have the right to ask residents to remove decorations that may be considered racist, sexist, discriminatory, pornographic, or offensive.

If the resident refuses to do so the residential life staff member may confiscate the item and the resident will be subject to disciplinary action for refusal to remove the object(s).

## DECORATING POLICY

Students can decorate residential units but must adhere to the following restrictions:

- 1. Painting walls, ceilings, floors, fixtures or furniture is not permitted.
- 2. Do <u>NOT</u> use 3M brand or similar products on walls or wood surfaces. Mounting tape, scotch tape, double sided tape, poster tape, packaging tape, electrical tape, duct tape, and putty are not allowed. Residents will be charged for damages caused by these products.
- 3. Do not attach LED lights with adhesive to the walls, furniture, fixtures or ceilings.
- 4. Wallpaper, border paper, stickers, or anything that will permanently adhere to the wall or furniture is not allowed.
- 5. Posters, pictures, bulletin boards, and other decorations may be hung on walls using thumbtacks and small nails only. Anything used to hang items to a wall must be completely removable and not cause damage to painted wall surfaces. Any material that may leave a sticky residue after being removed is not allowed. Screws and large nails are not allowable hardware for mounting objects to the wall.
- 6. Paper with adhesive backing is not permitted to line drawers or shelves.
- 7. Items cannot be hung from fire sprinkler heads or pipes. Damage to sprinkler heads could result in flooding for which the resident(s) would be held financially responsible.
- 8. No items can be hung from the ceiling or fixtures or in any window or doorway.
- 9. No items can be placed or hung on the front doors of residential units unless posted by a residential life or public safety staff member (ex: a note, letter, door decoration, form or flyer taped to the front of a door).
- 10. Empty alcohol containers or soda cans or bottles may not be used as decorations.
- 11. Live Christmas trees are not permitted. Christmas lights are allowed but must be unplugged when unattended and cannot be hung from the ceiling or any room fixtures including pipes, smoke detectors, sprinklers, and lights.

#### EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION SYSTEM

All residents are strongly encouraged to register for the campus emergency notification system to receive emergency text messages and emails.

Charges may apply for this service and Ranken is not responsible for any associated charges. Given the fact that residents are on campus so much more than commuter students, and emergencies can take place any time day or night, we feel it is in our resident's best interest to register for this notification system.

To register for the emergency notification system, go to InsideRanken and complete the Omni Alert registration.

## RESIDENT SERVICES

#### Laundry

Walker Hall has a laundry room located on the second floor. The laundry room has card access for those students who have paid for a laundry plan. The cost for the Laundry Plan is \$75 during the academic year and \$35 during the midyear, spring and summer semester.

#### Mail

The mailroom is located on the first-floor west wing of Walker Hall. Each resident will receive a mailbox key and will be assigned a mailbox. If you wish to receive mail at Ranken, all mail you receive must include the following address:

If you receive a package, a note will be placed in your mailbox. Please see the Residential Life staff member on duty to receive your package from the mailroom before 10:00 p.m.

#### **Transportation**

The Director of Residential Life will schedule trips to the grocery store. Residents can check the building bulletin boards and their Ranken email account for scheduled trips.

Transportation for medical appointments or to the airport, train and bus station is also available based on the schedule of the Director of Residential Life

#### Fresh Ideas Dining Hall

The Fresh Ideas Dining Hall will have the following schedule for the school year:

#### Monday through Thursday (Closed on holidays)

#### **4 BEDROOM APARTMENT**

The living room and kitchen is shared among the 2 residents. <u>Residents provide their own</u> <u>living room and dining room furniture.</u>

There are 2 bathrooms with a vanity (Sink and Mirror) provided for each resident. The first bathroom has a toilet and shower for two occupants. The second bathroom has a toilet and shower for two occupants.

There is also a storage closet which is accessible to all residents.
